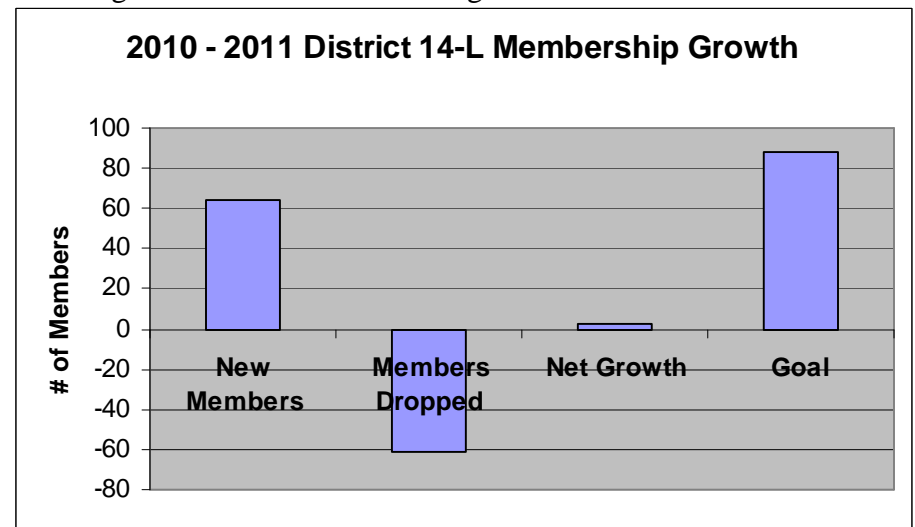

From the Desk of 2nd Vice District Governor Bill Higgins, Jr.....

Sadly, since our last newsletter, we lost a great Lion in Zone Chair Barb Turek. My condolences go out to Past District Governor Mike and his family on their loss. Amy and I were able to attend the memorial service, which was well attended by Lions whose lives were touched by Barb's service. Please keep the Turek family in your prayers.

On a more positive note, I was pleased to receive a message from District Governor Larry Edwards, that District 14-L is back on the positive side of 1200. I spoke recently at the District Cabinet Meeting and stated that 1200 members should be our "Mendoza" line. Not considering that my statement may go over the heads of

non-sports fans, I was asked by PDG Gerald Chapman to explain that phrase. So, for the benefit of non-sports fans, the Mendoza Line is an informal term used in baseball for the threshold of incompetent hitting. Even though Mario Mendoza's lifetime batting average was .215, the Mendoza Line is said to occur at .200, and when a position player's batting average falls below that level, the player is said to be below the Mendoza Line. It is often thought of as the offensive threshold below which a player's presence in Major League Baseball cannot be justified despite his defensive abilities (from *Wikipedia*). 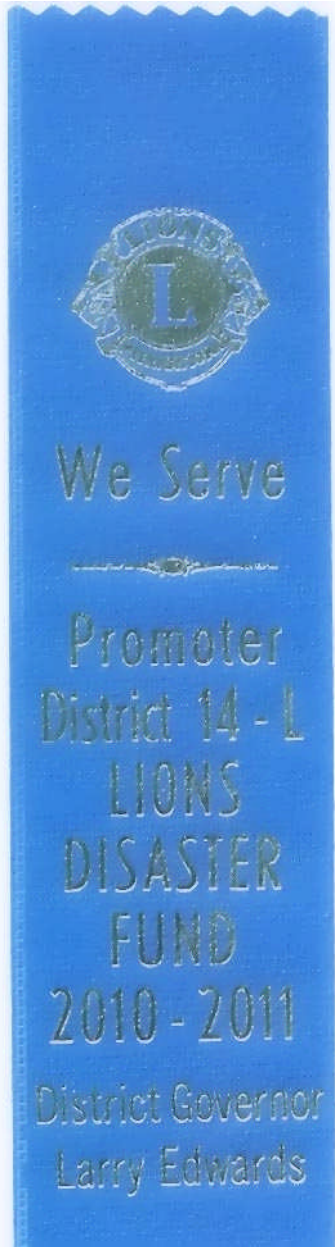

The Coordinator's major role is to provide encouragement, coaching, and motivational aids for all Lions, especially district Leo Clubs Chairpersons.

A Lion wishing to serve in this position shall have knowledge of the Leo program; have served as a club liaison, sub-district chairperson or worked with other youth groups in the community; have good communications skills.

Any Lion interested in this position may contact the PA Lions State Office at (717) 564-2586 or DG Larry for further details regarding qualifications and duties. The Lion must submit a resume to the District Governor no later than April 1st. The District Governor will in turn submit the resume to the State Office no later than April 10th.
