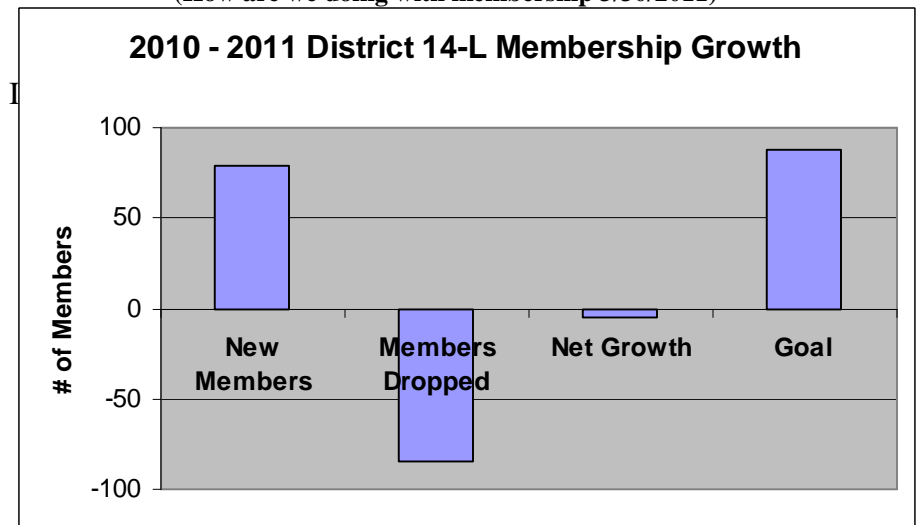

### **“MD-14 Leo Clubs Coordinator”**

At the State Council meeting held February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011, the Council of Governors approved the change from a Multiple District 14 Leo Committee to a Leo Coordinator Position as it follows the recommendation outlined by Lions Clubs International.

The Coordinator shall serve a three-year appointment as outlined by Lions Clubs International. The appointment may be made from any sub-district in the Multiple District. The appointment will be made at the State Council meeting in May prior to the State Convention.

The Coordinator's major role is to provide encouragement, coaching, and motivational aids for all Lions, especially district Leo Clubs Chairpersons.

A Lion wishing to serve in this position shall have knowledge of the Leo program; have served as a club liaison, sub-district chairperson or worked with other youth groups in the community; have good communications skills.

Any Lion interested in this position may contact the PA Lions State Office at (717) 564-2586 or DG Larry for further details regarding qualifications and duties. The Lion must submit a resume to the District Governor no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>. The District Governor will in turn submit the resume to the State Office no later than April 10<sup>th</sup>.
